Class 2 Large Gold Marigold. 1 bloom, 3" in diameter

Class 3 Large Yellow Marigold. 1 bloom, 3" in diameter

Class 4 Large White Marigold. 1 bloom, 3" in diameter

Class 5 Medium Marigolds. 3 Blooms, 2" in diameter

*5-1 Yellow, 5-2 Orange, 5-3 Bi-Color, 5-4 Rust, 5-5 Burgundy, 5-6 White

Class 6 Small Marigolds 3 Blooms under 1¾" in diameter

*6-1 Yellow, 6-2 Orange, 6-3 Bi-Color, 6-4 Rust, 6-5 Burgundy, 6-6 White

Class 7 Petite Marigolds 3 blooms under 1" in diameter

Class 8 Best Collection of Medium Marigolds. 3 blooms. 2" in diameter

Class 9 Arrangement Predominate Marigolds, under 6"

Class 10 Arrangement Predominate Marigolds, 6-10 inches

Class 11 Arrangement Predominate Marigolds over 10 inches

Class 12 Bouquet of Marigolds

Class 13 Outstanding potted Marigold

***Classes 1-12 can be shown in bottles, as only the bloom is judged**

Cash prizes of \$3 for 1st place, \$2 for 2nd place and \$1 for 3rd place will be awarded for the Marigold Classes.

Class 25 Arrangement, over 10 inches of any flowers

Class 26 Arrangement, under 6 inches of any flowers

Class 27 Bouquet of Wildflowers. Will be judged on the number of varieties and the arrangement

Class 28 Bouquet of Garden Flowers

Class 29 Bouquet of Hydrangeas

RULES:

1. Competition is open to everyone, regardless of age or place of residence.

2. Entries accepted from 4:00PM to 8:30PM Friday.

3. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st Place, 2nd place, and 3rd place in each class.

4. Blooms shown in competition must be grown by exhibitor, except exhibits entered in Classes 14-29.

5. Arrangements are judged on design of the materials, the appropriateness of the container and color.

6. Entry tabs with class number and variety visible and exhibitor's name concealed will be furnished.

7. Arrangements are in floral foam or "frogs" flower holders. Otherwise they are bouquets.

8. The number of entries in each class is not limited, but only one award per exhibitor will be given in each class. No exhibit can be entered in more than one class.

9. No awards will be made unless exhibits are considered sufficiently meritorious by the judges.

10. The show committee will not assume responsibility for injury to exhibits or loss of containers.

11. Exhibits MAY NOT BE REMOVED before the end of the show at 4PM Sunday.
